Ageing in place

Ageing in place is a term being used more frequently to describe the changing needs of a resident throughout their time in a care home and must be considered early on in the journey.

Pressure injuries and falls pose one of the greatest threats to the physical health as well as the psychological wellbeing of residents in nursing homes and homes for the elderly. Injuries caused by falls cost health insurers billions every year. However, falls can have far more drastic consequences for those affected. Some may never fully recover from their injuries, leaving them dependent on assistive devices for the rest of their lives. Therefore, having a bed that can also be adapted to suit individualised care needs is ever more desirable.

wissner-bosserhoff recently supplied beds to Nyton House care home in Chichester, West Sussex. The beds have been used to furnish the Coach House wing of the facility, a newly-created area that primarily houses residents with dementia. Therefore, particular emphasis was placed on the safety of the residents and guaranteeing them the greatest possible degree of independence.

The proven SafeFree side rail system and the SafeSense bed exit system with integrated night light were decisive purchase criteria for Nyton House, which already uses wissner-bosserhoff upholstered hotel design nursing beds in other areas of the home.

SafeSense 3 by wissner-bosserhoff is an integrated real-time movement monitoring device, which can detect dangers at an early stage and corresponding warning messages can be recorded silently if preferred or forwarded as an active DECT (digital enhanced cordless telecommunication) call.

If forwarded, staff are notified of a resident's lack of movement in bed, enabling them to quickly identify and respond to pressure injury risks. The recorded 24-hour movement profile



also provides a good database for further anamnesis.

The bed exit monitoring provides nursing staff with an overview of bed occupancy at all times and an individualised bed exit message can be set for residents depending on the care requirements. This technology can significantly change the way care is prioritized and provide effective relief to night and weekend teams, especially when short staffed.

SafeSense 3 can also be optionally equipped with a moisture assistant. If there is moisture in the bed, a silent alarm is transmitted to the monitoring system and, if necessary, a call can also be transmitted to the call system available in the home. The moisture assistant detects moisture in the bed at an early stage and helps to better protect residents from maceration and pressure injuries.

wissner-bosserhoff's SafeSense 3 is compatible with current operating systems such as Windows, Android and iOS and the functionalities can be flexibly expanded to offer a future-proof solution.

Serving up good maintenance

The ability to age in place is not only beneficial to the resident but also cost-effective for the care provider and environmentally friendly. Couple all the above advantages with a comprehensive



service and maintenance plan, and the average life cycle of a wissner-bosserhoff product is circa 15 years. Compared to beds and mattresses that cannot be serviced, cleaned and decontaminated properly - and/or adapted - the longevity of wissner-bosserhoff's bed can be up to three times longer.
